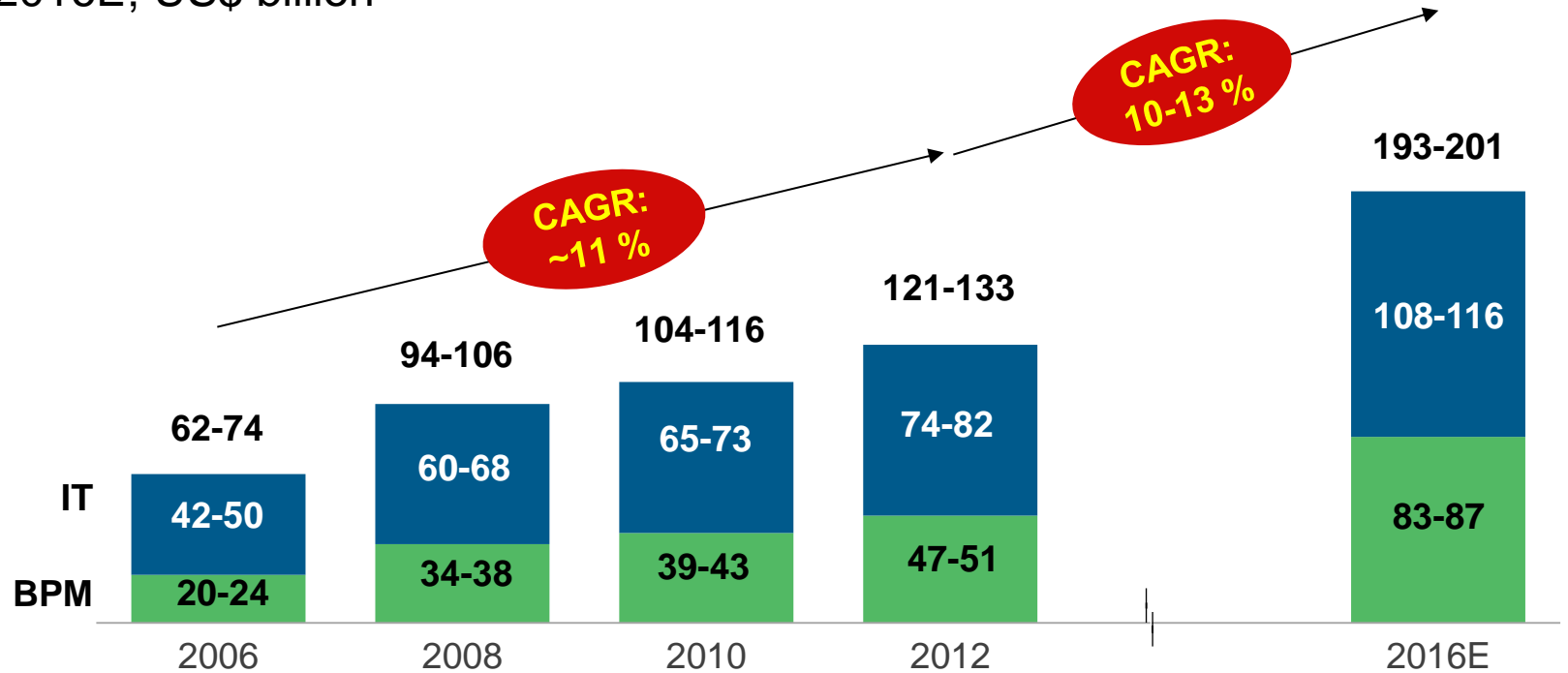

Number of offshore jobs (millions)	~2.3	~3.4	~3.8	~4.1	~6-6.5

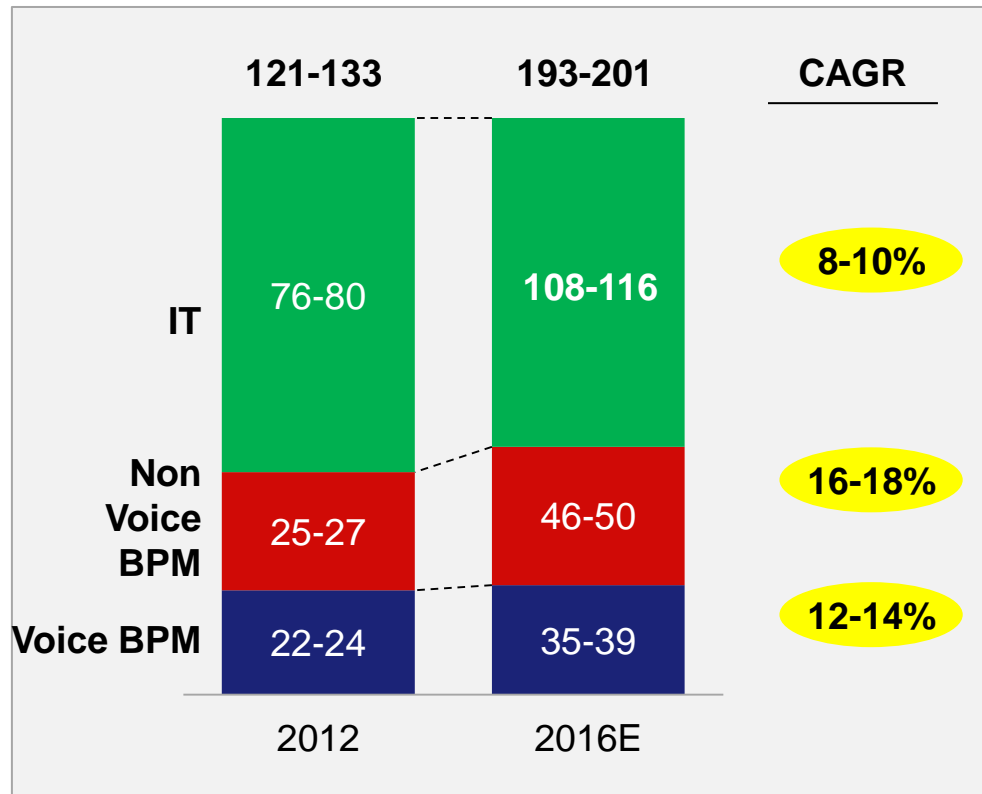

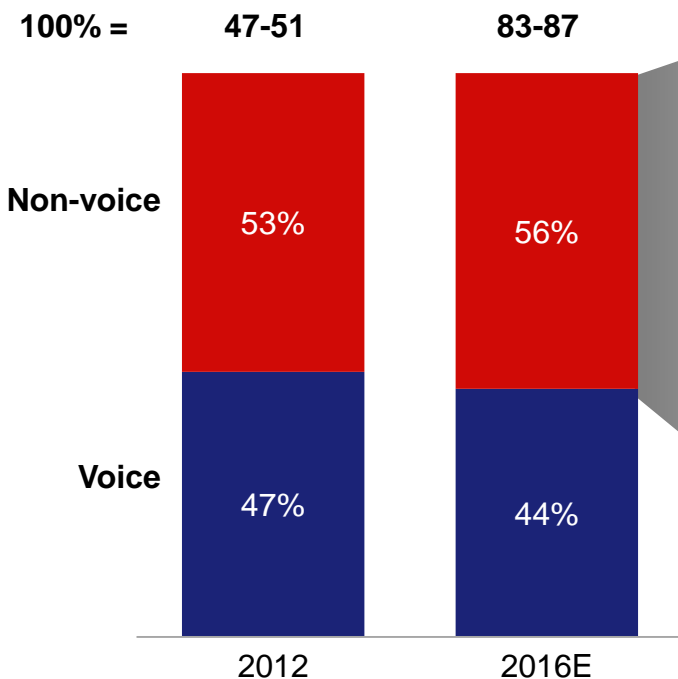
Global offshore services market 2012 - 2016E; US\$ billion



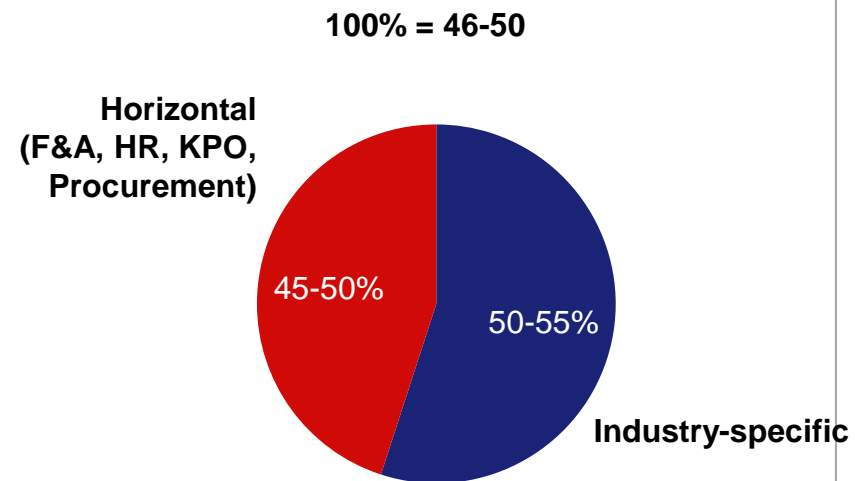
- BPM market is expected to grow at a faster pace compared to IT market by 2016

2012 - 2016E; US\$ billion

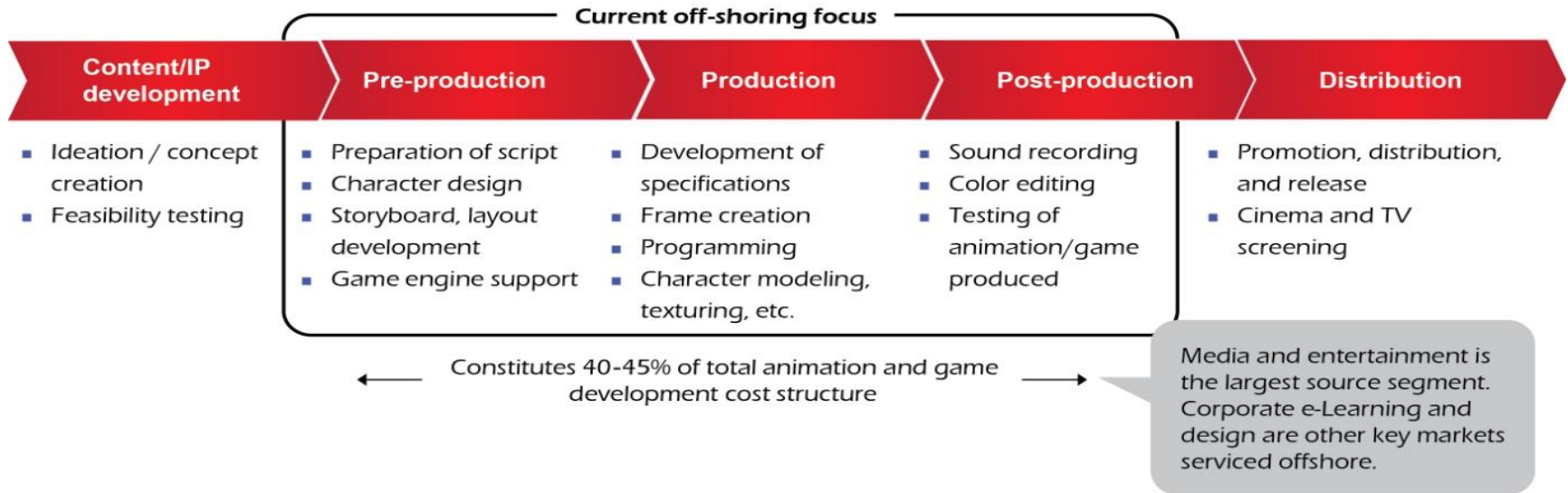


Global offshore opportunity in non voice

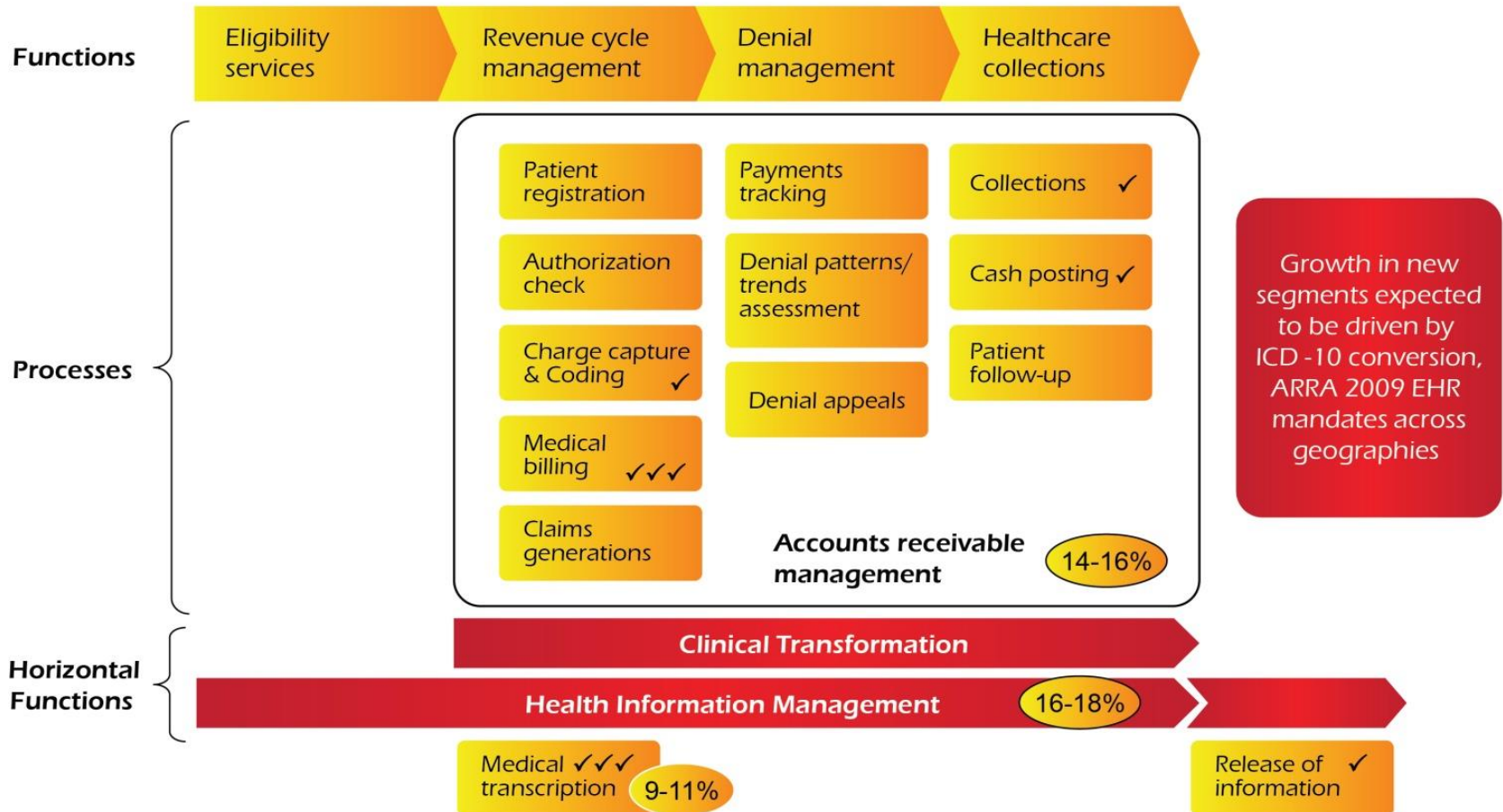

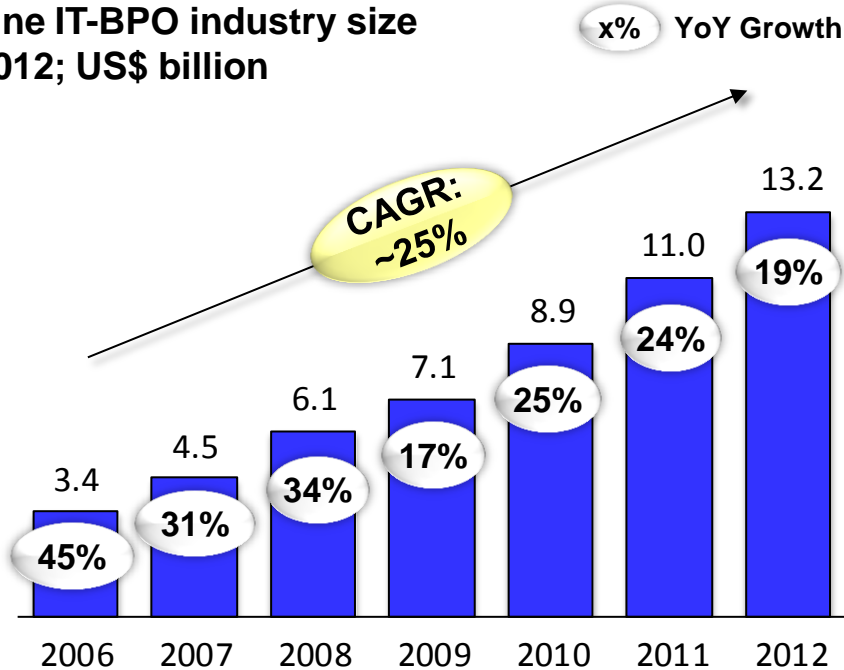
